ur April Program will be presented by George Carr and is titled "The Genus Catasetum - weird and wonderful."

George is an accredited American Orchid Society Judge in the Florida North Central Judging Center in Tampa, Florida and has been growing orchids for 35 years. His interest in the genus *Cycnoches* began in 1993 when he requested to do his research paper on the genus for his Student Judge requirement. His paper, *Cycnoches – One Hundred Sixty-five Years of Confusion* was completed and



presented in 1995 and in 1996 the paper was awarded the first American Orchid Society Education Certificate of Appreciation. In 2003, George was named as an accepted American Orchid Society taxonomic authority on the Catasetinae specializing in *Cycnoches*.

George has published some 35 articles in the United States in <u>Orchids</u> and the <u>Orchid Digest</u>, Brazil, France in <u>Richardiana</u>, England in the <u>Orchid Review</u> and Colombia. His most recent paper on <u>Cycnoches</u> and hybrids of the genus was published in a supplement to the October 2012 issue of the American Orchid Society magazine <u>Orchids</u>.

George is retired but stays busy with his research and writings about the Catasetinae and other orchids. He has a blog on the Catasetinae, http://catasetinae5.blogspot.com, where, from time to time, he publishes articles with photographs of plants and flowers which interest him and which he hopes will interest others.

We hope you will join us for this very interesting presentation.





refreshment table. Everybody knows of the time restrictions that most everyone faces every day. Having to rush to an orchid meeting after a long day and having to think about dinner doesn't translate into a good meeting for anyone. I feel that your contributions make a difference in our meetings atmosphere. So, again, my personal thanks to everybody that contributed with this effort.

I want to share a tip on how to liquefy solids to use on a hose end dial sprayer. Firstly, you don't want to use the hose end sprayers that allow water into the container. Those start heavy and finish light, not accurate at all. You want to use the sprayers with the little spigot attached to the lid, and a dial. Now, you set the dial to say '4 ounces', what that means is that the sprayer will syphon 4 oz. of 'prepared liquid' from your container into a gallon of water as the water passes through your hose. What you do then, is pour your dry chemical, be it fertilizer, fungicide, insecticide, etc. at the desired rate with 4 ounces of water to make a liquid concentrate. For example, if you are using 20-20-20 at the rate of 1 tablespoon (tbs.) per gallon of water. You pour 1 tbs. into

the 4oz. of water in your container. The tablespoon of 20-20-20 will dissolve into the 4 oz. of water. And it will be then syphoned into a gallon of water as it passes through your hose. Basically you dissolve any powder at the desired rate of use, be it a teaspoon, two teaspoons, a tablespoon, whatever the measurement asks for, into those 4 oz. of water to get a gallon of finished spray.

Now, you tell me, but I have too many plants and I use 5 gallons of water. Easy! Every 4 ounces of water in your container will equal a gallon of finished spray. So for a final spray of 5 gallons, you will fill the container to 20oz. of water, (5 gal. @ 4oz/Gal. = 20oz.), ad 5 tablespoons (to continue using the 20-20-20 example of 1 tbs. x gal.) You have to keep the dial at the same 4oz., because that will make the sprayer siphon only 4 oz. of prepared concentrate into a gallon of water.

If I managed to confuse you even more, I will bring a sprayer to our next meeting and show you all then. You can contact me at 305-253-7080, or come visit us at OFE with your hose end sprayer. I will be happy to show you in person.
