 $m{B}$ arbara Mae Williams Fuchs, 89, passed away on June 24, 2015 in Harrison, Tennessee. Barbara was born in Homestead in 1925, the second daughter of prominent farmer Casper Williams and his wife Mae Williams.

She met her future husband, Frederick J. Fuchs, Jr. at a school basketball game. They were married in 1944 at Homestead Methodist Church (now First United Methodist Church), and she remained a lifelong member of the church even after her post-Hurricane Andrew move to Tennessee. Barbara was a devoted wife and mother of 5, widowed after 46 years of marriage.

Barbara and Fred traveled the world during their years together, visiting many parts of the Americas and Asia in conjunction with their tour group business (Orchid Collectors, Inc.) and for other orchid-related events. With Fred, she ran Fuchs Orchids in Naranja. Fred was President of SFOS in 1965, and with Barbara, they were active members of the society.
