# SFOS March /April, 2020 Program — Steve Rodriguez

Hello SFOS Members and friends, Hope everyone is staying home, staying safe and working on your orchids.

It was a true honor that the first question to the our ask "THE ORCHID DOCTORS" project at our February auction, was directed to me.

The question was...."What is Steve's secret to such beautiful plants??"

This may sound a little corny but.... My secret is lots of tender love & care! LOL, Honestly it truly takes a lot of time, work, dedication & lots of patience's

In the morning's before I go to work, I water and check all the orchids and later after I get home from work, I spend lots of hours working on my orchids, weekends too.

These plants thrive in strong light, but not direct lateafternoon sunlight (although dendrobiums can handle more sun).

Light is the key element to growing amazing orchids and

getting them to bloom year after year.

They also need high humidity and airflow around the roots. They need regular periods of drying alternated with heavy watering. Orchids do best in temperatures above 50 degrees but below 85 degrees.

Fertilizing is also very important, as a general rule, fertilize orchids every 2 weeks during peak growth (spring and

summer) and once a month during dormancy (fall and winter).

My suggestion is that you read "An Introduction to Orchids" by South Florida Orchid Society (Edited by Julie Rosenberg) & the "Florida Orchid Growing Month by Month" Book by Martin R. Motes.

I also suggest visiting our SFOS monthly group meetings to take advantage of all the knowledgeable guest speakers

sharing and ideas, tips & tricks on how to care for orchids and help you grow them beautiful.
