

Meet Our Commercial Growers: Carlos Cahiz of OFE international

This month we're debuting a new feature to help us get through this Corona Mess that we're calling *Meet our Commercial Growers*. And, to start things off with a bang, our very own Carlos Cahiz had consented to share his knowledge of how to prepare our orchids for the rainy season! Thanks, Carlos!

How to prepare orchids to survive our South Florida rainy season.

Growing orchids outdoors in South Florida demands us to find a formula that works for our two season year. We are all familiar with our Dry and Hot season, and also our Wet and Hotter season.

We will converse about options for our orchids during our Wet and Hotter season. Rains bring with them fungi, bacteria, and snails. I will try to share my experiences with these problems.

Fungi/Bacteria: Fungi and bacteria are opportunistic organisms. They will take advantage of any weakened system to colonize and propagate. You know you have bacteria because of the bad smell mushy leaves, bulbs, canes. Fungi's telltale sign are those large black spots on the leaves with a light green ring. Sunburn damage is more of a irregular blemish on the leaves. We at OFE sell the following products to control them:



Physan-20 is a mild fungicide, bactericide, algaecide, disinfectant which is completely safe on plants. You can use it at the rate of a tablespoon per gallon of water as often as you desire. One of the advantages of using Physan-20 is that it washes the sugary secretions from our plants, taking away a feeding incentive for ants and aphids. Ideally you would be using Physan-20 at least once a month on your plants. You can use as often as after every rain storm to help dry off your orchids.



Dithane M-45. It is a topical water soluble fungicide. The 'M' stands for Mancozeb, an old name in fungal control. You use it on your plants to kill fungi on their leaves. Two teaspoons per gallon of water is the popular solution. Apply it for three weeks in a row for best results.



Thiomyl: A systemic water soluble fungicide. You use it to control fungi on your leaves and roots. Its suggested solution is two teaspoons per gallon of water. Because it is systemic, plants have to absorb it, so it takes longer for it to be effective. The advantage of using Thiomyl is that it will not wash off when you water your plants.

We can combine both Thiomyl and Dithane M-45 at the same rate each per gallon of water. This combination gives you a topical and systemic, 'one-two' punch which is very effective.

Organic/Home remedies: Hydrogen peroxide to clean and disinfect. Cinnamon to dry up, kill and cauterize.

Heavy duty Chemicals: Aliette, Banrot, Cleary's 3336, Kocide, Truban, Distance, Subdue Maxx. These are only available in commercial sizes, prices ranging from \$90 to \$300.













Slugs and Snails: These critters thrive in our rainy season. They hide in our media, and come out at night to devour our orchids. You can tell that you have snails because the leaves will be eaten and there will be little filaments left on the wound. The assorted baits available in the market will mold and become ineffective after they are wet. So you have to replace it repeatedly.



We sell Deadline M-P brand bait. The M-P stand for micro pellets. These pellets are the only one that hold together after being exposed to water.

Deadline is available in a 1 Lb. bag, or a 10 Lb. bag.

Organic/Home remedies: Use a shallow tray filled with beer. Snails are attracted to the yeast in the beer, go in and drown. Hydrogen Peroxide, spray at night directly on the snails/slugs and watch them melt. I have heard that Epsom salt works on them, but I have not tried it. Copper tape repels them.

Heavy duty chemicals: Metaldehyde, is the active ingredient and the commercial choice for snail killing. We carry Slug-Fest. It comes in a 2.5 gallon container for \$1370

South Florida Orchid Society 2020 Show

After serious consideration, the difficult decision was made to cancel THE 74th MIAMI INTERNATIONAL ORCHID SHOW which had been scheduled to be held at The Watsco Center on the University of Miami Campus Oct 3-4, 2020.

As you many of you know, a great deal of preparation is done by our Show Chair Dan Christensen for many many months in advance, planning and attending to a myriad of details, which results in our show being a successful event for both our attendees and our show vendors.

Not only does SFOS need to meet deadlines for deposits on contracts required to produce our show, we also require our Vendors to make advance deposits to participate. The vendors must make advance travel and hotel arrangements for themselves in addition to planning for the shipping and delivery of their plants and booth display equipment

Even with social distancing and wearing face coverings the Coronavirus Pandemic is still being spread in our and other communities and countries. We do not know what the public health situation will be in the Fall. We do not know if Universities will still be conducting classes virtually, or if visitors will be allowed on campus or with what restrictions. In many cities and states, there is much uncertainty going forward as to even which events should be postponed or cancelled. For SFOS there is no way to guarantee that we would be allowed to hold our SFOS Show, or what restrictions might be placed on our attendees, vendors and volunteers, regardless of all of the advance planning.

Many decisions will be made in the coming months concerning future attendance at large gatherings such as concerts, theater sporting events (and even orchid shows) which for the most part have all been put on hold, or cancelled for the remainder of 2020.

To quote our Show Chair Dan Christensen, "this decision to cancel has been made for the safety of our patrons and vendors". For our members, vendors and visitors that were looking forward to our show, this is a huge disappointment. But, we will get thru this, and as we go thru the different phases of recovery in the coming months, we can look forward to our show being held in 2021. And that will be cause for celebration.


Conversations With Our Members



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
